

CHIEF OF PUBLIC SAFETY

The Greater Baltimore Committee (GBC) maintains that addressing public safety is at the top of its agenda as it is integral to the health of the Greater Baltimore region and its residents and essential to achieving inclusive economic growth.

GBC is committed to this priority as follows:

Hiring a Chief of Public Safety – A senior GBC staff member or consultant accountable to the GBC CEO and board, exclusively focused on partnering with public and private sector resources to support the development, implementation, and measurement of effective public safety strategies and achieved outcomes across the Greater Baltimore region.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- **Work of the Chief of Public Safety will include, among other duties, the following:**
 - Build and maintain close relations and regular contact with key community leaders, policy makers and partners on public safety issues
 - Work with local communities, elected officials, law enforcement, and businesses to develop, implement, and monitor solutions that demonstrably improve regional public safety
 - Conduct research and analysis of policy issues related to local, regional, and state public safety needs and opportunities, including root cause analysis
 - Monitor, develop, and advocate for effective public policy
 - Create, write, and disseminate research-based issue briefs, fact sheets, opinion articles, blog posts, and other materials that promote effective near-, mid-, and long-term strategies and policies

- **General Scope**
 - Accountability - Issue monthly reports and recurring briefs to the GBC Board of Directors and its members on the progress/implementation of the public safety strategies or programs and to provide transparent statistics on GBC website and media efforts
 - Assess regional public safety strategies, including how they are being operated, goals and metrics for success, status of implementation, and transparency of results
 - Monitor, follow up and organize assistance from the business community to the activities of local law enforcement, elected officials, as well as the Baltimore Mayor's Office of Neighborhood Safety & Engagement representatives
 - Represent the GBC by serving on various committees, task forces, commissions, councils and working groups to contribute to and monitor implementation of programs and strategies and determine how business community can support these efforts
 - Effectively engage the business community and provide resources to support public safety and reform efforts
 - Track and analyze federal, state, and local policy and legislation and prepare summaries, impact analyses, and recommendations to keep GBC leadership abreast of new legislation and trends affecting public safety

- **Data collection, management, and analysis**
 - Provide quantitative analysis of data
 - Prepare reports and other products
 - Prepare data visualizations or infographics for reports, website, and other products
 - Present data analysis and research to various audiences and help with translating findings to non-experts/specialists

- **Qualifications of the Chief of Public Safety:**
 - Ability to evaluate data, identify issues presented, and promote, recommend, or initiate action or response
 - Knowledge of law enforcement and judiciary
 - Familiar with a broad array of public safety data sources and how to access and analyze data
 - Skill to communicate and work collaboratively with state and regional government officials and law enforcement entities
 - Serve as a neutral advocate who is seen as an honest broker and not viewed as favoring any stakeholder involved in public safety. The primary goal of the position will be to evaluate and assess the successful implementation of public safety strategies in the Baltimore region and ensure accountability of all stakeholders
